Bellevue was founded in 1815 by settlers who traveled to Ohio from Genesee County, New York, originally calling it Amsden Corners, but the first store did not open until eight years later. Gradually a school, other businesses including shops, a flour mill, distillery and a tannery opened up to complement that first store. The area was “officially” recognized by the government, with the opening of a Post Office in 1828.



A lot has changed over the years but history still abounds in this village of about 8,000, with its small-town atmosphere and friendly residents.

While our visits are planned, but not disclosed to our passengers, we do want to let you know that this Semi-Mystery Tour includes wine with our luncheon, plus winetasting, and 2 gifts as we visit places in the region that was part of the Firelands Territory, with portions originally named “Lyme” after a similar community in Connecticut from which many of the first residents

arrived in 1808. That town was, interestingly, named after the town of Lyme Regis in England.

During today’s tour, we will be seeing the growth that took place due to region being halfway between Toledo and Cleveland, leading to many of the changes you will be seeing.
