SIGHTS UNSEEN

Much of it has been restored with shops of the time; even the restaurant, a blacksmith shop and "Lock 27" greet you, just as during the period of the American Civil War. Even when the railroads came into this area, the canal continued to supply water for many years.

We will be dining at the Steak N' Stein Warehouse Restaurant in historic Roscoe Village and touring the restored shops and buildings.

Afterwards, we will board a horse-drawn canal boat that still plies the water as a pair of horses pull the boat along the smooth water, as they did years ago.


In Titusville, lumber was the main industry, then a way to bring oil up from the ground was invented. The story of Colonel Edwin Drake and his drilling to bring up the oil is fascinating and you will be learning about it as we tour Drake's Well. When the borough

transitioned from lumber to oil, Titusville had more millionaires for its population than anywhere else in the world, leading to the construction of the Union City & Titusville Railroad which eventually became part of the Philadelphia & Erie Railroad.

We will be traveling along those same tracks, reliving the oil history as we ride through "the valley that changed the world". We board at an 1892 railroad station and travel back more than 150 years into the heart of Oil Country in vintage rail cars built by the Pullman Company in the 1930s.

This evening we will be enjoying a leisurely dinner before checking into the nearby lodging area where the rooms are made up of Cabooses. Like similar motels across the country; each unit has its own heating & air conditioning, television, telephone and shower. 




Lexington is in the Heart of Bluegrass Country of Kentucky and home of the legendary horses and world-famous bourbon. Since good food always appeals to everyone, we will continue this tradition when we arrive in Birmingham at the "centerpiece" of Fannie Flagg's 1987 novel, "Fried Green Tomatoes", known in the book as "The Whistle Stop Café". You will be able to select your entree including, of course, fried green tomatoes. Birmingham offers so much to visitors including the Barber Vintage Motorsports Museum (with cars and motorcycles stacked as high as seven shelves), Civil Rights Trails & Institutes, Science Centers, Aquariums and the Birmingham Botanical Gardens, to name some of the attractions. We will be touring what was known as the "Pittsburgh of the South" due to its Steel-producing industries, seeing both the Vulcan Monument and the Sloss Iron Works, now a museum to past industrialization. As we travel through Scottsboro, we will be visiting the gigantic-sized store. Founded in 1972, this now nationally-renown store features unclaimed and lost items, including those discovered at airports, at significantly-reduced prices.

Huntsville is one of the fastest growing cities in the southeastern part of our country, largely due to a combination of its rich history of southern hospitality and innovative high-tech ventures and cultural diversity. In fact, more than 100 languages and dialects are spoken in the city. The first American satellite was sent into orbit from the city in 1958. One of the "Fathers of Rocket Science," Wernher von Braun, lived and worked in Huntsville during the 1950s and 1960s, launching the space and rocket industry still associated with the city today.

In the 1800s, steamboats were a most-popular form of transportation on Lake Chautauqua and many people chose to enjoy a leisurely cruise on a warm, sunny day. The first vessel appeared on the lake as early as 1875 with those original ships seeing service for many years with the last of those vessels, the "City of Jamestown" finally being retired in 1963. But, less than 25 years later, some enterprising people had an entirely new paddlewheeler constructed to bring back that period in the lake's history. 


The Piquette Avenue Plant is considered the "birthplace of the Model T" car and has been recognized as one of the most significant automotive heritage sites in the world.

Woodworking is an important part of Northwest Ohio's heritage. While pedaling the foot-powered lathe or jigsaw, costumed guides will share stories about the skill of woodworkers before the age of electricity. People of many faiths helped settle the area, with the church being the heart of small communities; the village church has a 100-year old pump organ. You can visit a small town doctor's

office, houses, a water-powered grist mill and even a schoolhouse from the days before cafeterias, gymnasiums and computers. At the print shop, you can observe a printer that uses a hand press and linotype. Mid-afternoon, we board the 100-passenger MV Sandpiper for a cruise to discover the Maumee River, and see sights such as the landmark Veterans Glass City Skyway Bridge, yacht clubs, a shipyard and/or stately homes and wildlife. Industry flourished for many years due to the discovery, in 1888, of its vast amounts of natural gas. The city was also the location of the first church in the world to be lit by Thomas Edison's light bulbs and the first public building in the United States to be wired for electricity as it was being constructed. Tiffin has been known for being home to both Heidelberg University and Tiffin University, as well as the town where Ballreich Potato Chips are manufactured.

The history of this area goes back, so we rolled our price back to the tour price offered in 2022!

For many years, the city was an important glass and porcelain manufacturing center. While many of these companies are no longer around, there are several shops that still carry on this tradition. One of the first businesses in this region was a flour mill along the river so we will be dining at Pioneer Mill, enjoying some long-time favorites in a building constructed in 1822. which, of course, offers just about any cherry product you can imagine. Enjoy a "special dinner" near the shores of Grand Traverse Bay. We will also be seeing a neighborhood of "Mushroom Houses", leading you to believe that they must have come from a fairy tale.

The Valley Railway began back in the late 1800s, operating through what is now the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, from Cleveland to Zoarville. It transitioned into the Cleveland Terminal & Valley Railroad. Some years later it was absorbed into the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad which, in later years, merged with the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad, becoming the Chessie System.

The freight trains served companies like the Jaite Paper Mill and guarries along Riverview Road. Today, and for the past 50 years, the right-of-way has Cuyahoga Valley Scenic Railroad passenger trains operating through the National Park. We will be boarding our train at the Independence Station, far short of the original terminus in Zoarville, Ohio.

Enjoy our excursion as we travel through Peninsula and past popular areas such as Boston Mill Station and Indigo Lake, majestic bridges high above the tracks and historic stations, including the Brecksville Depot, a "flag stop" at the Station Road Bridge Trailhead.

Our motorcoach will be awaiting us as we exit the train in Akron to take us to our included mid-day dinner where you will have a choice of several entrees.
