


Great Day! Scheduled Tour Summary

FALL IN WISCONSIN'S DOOR COUNTY

TUE-TUE SEPT 12-19, 2017

Departures, as applicable, from Willoughby, Beachwood, Independence, Middleburg Hts, North Olmsted, Elyria, Sandusky

Door County is on a peninsula between Green Bay and Lake Michigan, in the state of Wisconsin. It's known for its long shoreline and many parks, including Sturgeon Bay that is fringed by limestone cliffs. It has been said that Door County more closely resembles New England than the Midwest. The weather is cooler and the leaves are starting to change . . . just perfect for this new tour package.



TUESDAY - We will have several stops during the day and, about dinner time, we will be arriving in the Delavan-Elkhorn-Lake Geneva area for a two-night stay. This area has remained a great destination, attracting guests for over 130 years since it is just 90 minutes from Chicago and is about 60 minutes from Milwaukee, Madison and Rockford. We will be dining in this area. Bon Appetit! **(D)**



WEDNESDAY – Since it is such a short distance, we will be visiting the Lake Geneva area today. Our first stop will be at the Riviera Docks for a US Mailboat Tour. There are only a handful of places left in the country where mail is still delivered by boat and none with a more exciting and scenic tour like this! Celebrating 100 years of mail service, about 75 homes around the lake receive their mail daily during the summer months, and during our 2-1/2 hour cruise, one of the crew members jumps off the boat to deliver the mail before jumping back onto the boat before it departs.

After a stop to purchase lunch we will be visiting Ten Chimneys, an estate put together by Broadway legends Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne. You will be greeted like Katherine Hepburn, Lawrence Olivier and other guests of the Lunts into this extraordinary home.

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All tour details are anticipated at the time that the Scheduled Tour Brochure was prepared and specific stops and/or other inclusions are subject to change or elimination without notice. Tours typically depart between 6 AM and 8 AM with the exact time shown on the itinerary you will receive approximately one to two weeks prior to the tour departure. Most tours return about 8 PM to 10 PM, although this may vary.

Tours of Ten Chimneys not only celebrate the one-of-a-kind collection the Lunts amassed during their lifetimes, but also honor the values found in every corner of their lives, both on the stage and in the house, they called home for more than half a century.

This evening we will be dining at the Red Geranium Restaurant where guests are served in one of five charming dining rooms. A “floor window” offering a view into the wine cellar, providing visitors with a unique conversational topic. **(B, D)**

THURSDAY – Breakfast is served at the resort and then we will depart for the Fireside Dinner Theatre. Following a delicious luncheon, we will be seeing the live performance of “*Elvis Lives, the Ultimate Elvis Tribute Event*”. At the conclusion, we will continue northward to Fond du Lac for a two-night stay; the name is French for “Bottom of the Lake” due to its location at the bottom of Lake Winnebago. **(B, LS)**



FRIDAY - Today, following breakfast, we will be visiting a number of area attractions including La Clare Farms. This goat farm in Fond du Lac has produced one of the top 15

goat cheeses in the world. It’s a one-of-a-kind goat-milking facility and on-site creamery. We also plan on discovering the beauty and natural wonders of Horicon Marsh, the largest freshwater cattail marsh in the United States. This extinct glacial lake is managed by the United States Fish & Wildlife Service. Additional stops are being finalized as we “go to press”, although we can assure you that dinner at a “traditional Wisconsin Supper Club” is included at Calumet Harbor in Pipe. It is situated about 30 feet from the shore of Lake Winnebago, featuring a beautiful view of the lake. **(B, D)**



SATURDAY – After breakfast we will depart for Green Bay with several visits such as at the National Railroad Museum and Lambeau Field, home of the Packers, and then continuing to Door County where we will be checking in for a two-night stay. You are in for a most unique experience, a traditional Door County Fish Boil. Just like the original Scandinavian settlers over a century ago, whitefish is cooked outdoors over an open fire, along with sweet onions and baby red potatoes; the oils from the fish, as it cooks, boil over the sides of the cook pot causing a spectacular lighting display, indicating that dinner can be served. **(B, D)**

SUNDAY – We will continue to a more-northern part of Door County, stopping at several locations including Seaquist Orchards Farm Market. Everything is locally grown and processed, including their popular fudge, jams and syrups.



At the Northport Pier, we will be boarding the ferry to Washington Island, about 7 miles northeast of the tip of Door Peninsula. The two-hour Cherry Train Tour will show us life on the island of about 660 residents, describing life, past and present; it highlights natural history, geology, settlement and the economy. A stop will be made in Sister Bay where we have lunch reservations at the famous Al Johnson's Swedish Restaurant. How spectacular is this place? Goats graze on the sod roof atop this casual log-cabin eatery that serves traditional Swedish fare. **(B, L)**

MONDAY - Enroute to Milwaukee we will be "taking the scenic route" along the lakeshore to the Sheboygan/Kohler area, making a stop at Country Ovens, known for their delicious chocolate-covered dry-cherries . . . a treat that some claim is so good it is almost addictive. making a stop in Kohler, Wisconsin to tour the Kohler Design Center. Once in our destination, a city known for its beer heritage, we will be taking a docent-led tour of "19th Century in the Streets of Old Milwaukee" display which highlights the brewing, industrial and history of the city. With its history of beer-making, we will be dining at a "bierhaus" in Milwaukee. **(B, D)**



TUESDAY – After breakfast we will be starting our trip towards home, but the inclusions continue. Our first stop will be in Racine, about 22 miles south of Milwaukee, on the shores of Lake Michigan. While we are traveling through the fifth-largest city, originally settled by immigrants including the Danes, Germans, and Czechs, we will be making a stop at O & H Bakery where your Driver and Tour Directors will be "spending the boss's money" as they purchase you a delicious, freshly-made Danish Kringle to take home. You'll soon find out why this large, delicious pastry has been awarded "Racine's Best". A luncheon will be included as we travel homeward. **(B, Kringle, L)**
