FRANKLIN PARK WITH A GERMAN FLAVOR

Central Ohio's Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens has a rich history that dates back to 1852 when 88 acres was purchased as the site of the first Franklin County Fair. Two years later it became the site of the Ohio State Fair before being influenced by the success of Chicago's World Fair and the 1893 Columbian Exposition. Shortly afterwards a grand Victorian-style glass greenhouse was constructed. It immediately became a popular destination with its carriage paths, lake and boathouse and quickly developed a reputation for horticultural excellence with the display of rare and unusual plants.

Franklin Park Conservatory and Botanical Gardens presents multi-faceted, art- and nature-based exhibitions throughout the year, all are designed by the staff. Special, temporary exhibitions by national and international artists are presented each year.

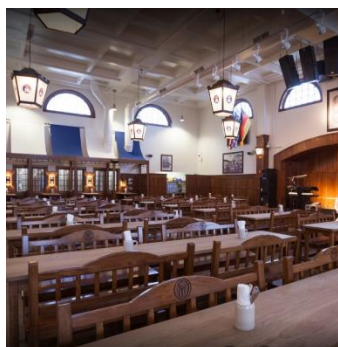

During this tour we will also be visiting both the John F. Wolfe Palm House and the connecting Dorothy M. Davis Showhouse, the oldest portions of the Conservatory and Botanical Gardens.

The Palm House highlights 43 species of palms from around the world, some of which are considered endangered and threatened in the wild.



We will be enjoying a mid-afternoon lunch, German-style. It will be a “Mittagsbuffet” with hot entrees, soup and salad . . . and, as usual, Great Day! has added specialty dessert. There will be traditional dishes that include schnitzel, chicken, fried cabbage and a “mett-wurst of the month”.
