THE WHISKEY REBELLION IN WASHINGTON

THURS JUNE 28, 2018

Departures, as applicable, from Elyria, North Olmsted, Middleburg Heights, Independence, Beachwood, Boston Heights.

David Bradford was a successful lawyer, businessman, and Deputy Attorney General of Washington County, Pennsylvania, taking a portion of his wealth to construct a home that was completed in 1788. It reflected his high social standing, not only by its size, but also by its fittings including the magnificent mahogany staircase and the wood finishes showing remarkable craftsmanship. He was not able to live here very long due to his involvement in the Whiskey Rebellion. Imagine waking up one morning and seeing that President George Washington ordered 13,000 troops to this small city, leading him to escape to present-day Louisiana; eventually he was pardoned for his role in the Whiskey Rebellion. The story is fascinating, but just the start of this tour.

Lunch will be unique at the Springhouse Country Restaurant, situated on an active farm. They sell a lot of their fresh milk and, it seems, that their famous Rich Chocolate Milk is one of the favorites. Everyone enjoys their made-from-scratch main dishes and desserts . . . and you get to select your meal.



There's been a lot of history in this area and, back in 1928, high-speed trolleys were constructed for runs between Pittsburgh and Washington. We will be visiting the museum that restores and displays these streetcars, enjoying a ride along their tracks. Two entertainers, Bobby Vinton and Perry Como, hailed from nearby Canonsburg. We will be making a stop at the popular Sarris Candies, with its glittery soda fountain. A stop will also be made at the local fast-food restaurant that honors these home town singing legends with memorabilia, photos, clothes and instruments. Busts of Como and Vinton have hidden motion sensors that trigger top hits to play when someone walks by.
