ROUNDHOUSES TO DEPOTS

SAT JULY 14, 2018

Departures, as applicable, from Willoughby, Beachwood, Independence, Broadview Hts.



Steam locomotives go back many years, having been developed in the early part of the 19th century. The first railroad in the country, the Baltimore & Ohio, opened about 1830. Today, even though many railroads now rely on diesel-power, they continue to play a key part of our economy. Our first visit of the day will be to the Age of Steam Roundhouse, a privately-owned facility, dedicated to preserving “steam locomotives, historic diesels, passenger cars and other railroad relics”. There’s even a full-scale, operating

and realistic roundhouse and back shop to overhaul, repair and maintain the founder’s rolling stock.

Our luncheon will be served today at a beautiful winery along the Tuscarawas River in Coshocton County. Needless to say, since we are here, a glass of wine will definitely “brighten up our day” as we get the signal to “highball” to our next stop, the Dennison Railroad Depot Museum. It is considered the most significant remaining example of a railroad canteen still reflecting its World War II heritage. During the war 1.3 Million service members going off to war were served free food by 4,000 working volunteers at the Dennison Depot Salvation Army Servicemen’s Canteen. This beautifully restored 1873 Pennsylvania Railroad Depot now has an orientation theater, historical railroad exhibits and the Whistle Stop Railway Shop. Join us as we walk through themed railroad cars and, on the depot grounds, explore steam locomotives, a nickel plate caboose and both freight and passenger cars. Please note that, at the Age of Steam Roundhouse, no one under the age of 10 is permitted, closed-toe shoes are required and each person will have a release to acknowledge before entry into the site. A fair amount of walking is required to view all that the roundhouse has to offer and, in our minds, is well worth it.
