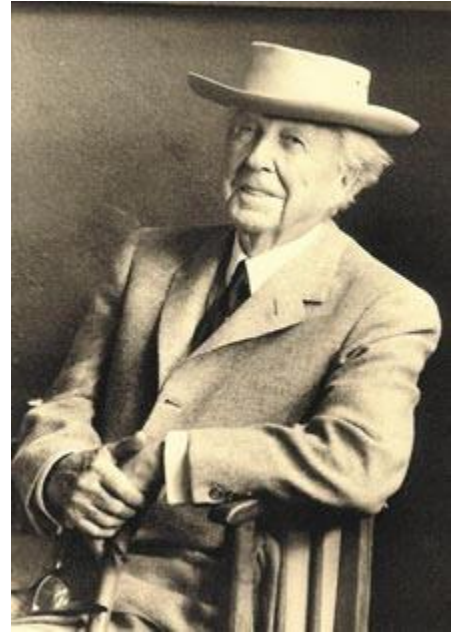
FALLINGWATER & FLIGHT 93 MEMORIAL

Fallingwater is one of the most unique homes in the world and it took people just as unique to make it happen. It was designed and built for the Kaufmann family of department store fame. Here Frank Lloyd Wright, possibly best known for his pork pie hat, was brought in as the designer of one of the greatest architectural triumphs of the 20th century. This is one of the type of tours that Great Day! has endeavored to give you to both provoke thought in some areas and to entertain your mind with the other stops.

One of the features of the house is that it is built over a waterfall. It has become famous, and is now a National Historic Landmark, as it does not appear to stand on solid ground, stretching out over the 30-foot waterfall. When completed, Wright explained to the Kaufmanns (who had wanted a view of the waterfall) that he had decided that,



instead of the view, they should “live with the waterfall”, to make it part of their everyday life and not just look at it now and then. This is the personality that he exhibited throughout his
