WASHINGTON, NEW MUSEUM & SHOW

TUE-THUR SEPT 25-27, 2018

TUESDAY – We will have a leisurely departure with a coffee stop and lunch break along the way. Upon our arrival we anticipate checking into our hotel to “freshen up” before traveling over to Columbia for dinner and entertainment.



At the conclusion of our meal we will be enjoying the musical, “Ain’t Misbehavin’, the Fats Waller Musical Show”.

The joint will be jumpin’ with one of the most popular revues of all time and a Tony Award winner for Best Musical. Thomas “Fats” Waller rose to international fame during the Golden Age of the Cotton Club with his infectious swing music. The show evokes the delightful humor and powerful energy of this “American original” with music made famous from uptown clubs to Tin Pan Alley to Hollywood!

WEDNESDAY – Breakfast is included at the hotel before we depart with our guide for more local touring in the Nation’s Capital. We will be seeing many of the monuments, some from the comfort of our coach, the Vietnam Memorial, World War II Memorial, the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial and other points of interest.

We have secured timed-tickets for the new National Museum of African American History & Culture. It’s a Smithsonian Institution museum that was established in 2003 and opened on September 24, 2016. It has almost 37,000 objects in its collection that are related to community, family, the arts, civil rights, religion, slavery and segregation. Alternate visits may include the African American Civil War Memorial. Located at the corner of Vermont Avenue, 10th St, and U Street NW, it commemorates the service of 209,145 African-American soldiers and sailors who fought for the Union in the American Civil War.

This evening a special dinner has been set up for you. We will be dining along the boardwalk on Georgetown Harbor, overlooking both the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts and the Potomac River. **(B, D)**

After the death of his older half-brother, Lawrence, in 1752, George Washington took up residence at the house that his father, Augustine Washington, had built in 1735. Over the next five decades, Washington expanded the house to create an impressive 21-room mansion with vibrant wall colors, intricate architectural details, and elegant furnishings. We will be touring two floors of this restored home and the surrounding estate. Following this visit there will be a buffet meal as we travel homeward. **(B, D)**
