

Great Day! Scheduled Tour Summary

NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND FALL FOLIAGE SUN-SAT SEPT 30-OCT 6, 2018

Departures, as applicable, from Westlake, Elyria, North Olmsted, Middleburg Heights, Independence, Beachwood, Willoughby, Ashtabula.

SUNDAY – Cruising the Erie Canal, dining on the waterfront – We will be traveling eastward to the small village of Herkimer in New York State, named after the German immigrants who settled in this area in 1722. Stops will be made along the way today. We will be arriving at Gems Along The Mohawk and boarding the Lil’ Diamond for a 1-1/2 hour cruise, traveling through one of the area’s locks before returning to the dock. Upon our arrival back at the dock, our chef-prepared dinner awaits us before we check into the Inn in the foothills of the beautiful Adirondack Mountains in Rome, New York. The group will be staying at a historic Inn on a quiet 52-acre “lavishly landscaped” estate this evening. **(D)**



MONDAY – Rutland, Vermont – After breakfast in the garden-like breakfast room known for its hospitality at the Inn, we will be traveling to Yankee Candle in South Deerfield, Massachusetts, touted as “America’s Most Loved Candle”, tracing its roots back to 1969 . . . and is just five years younger than Great Day! Tours. The shop offers 250,000 candles in more than 150 scents.



We will be able to have lunch in their café or other dining spots. Our rooms for the next two nights will be in Rutland, Vermont, at the Holiday Inn. A delicious dinner awaits us at the hotel this evening, selecting from popular dishes such as maple-glazed salmon and Vermont turkey with cranberry glaze. Here, we will be joining up with our New England guide who will be with us during this portion of the tour. Specific inclusions and timing may vary. **(B, D)**

TUESDAY – Vermont at its best – After a breakfast buffet we will visit the birthplace of Calvin Coolidge, our 30th President, and the Coolidge family homestead, enroute to the charming village of Woodstock with its pretty green town with the red-painted covered bridge. Enjoy lunch and shopping on your own. This afternoon we anticipate visiting Quechee Gorge, “Vermont’s Little Grand Canyon” and the Cabot Cheese Annex of Cabot Creamery.



We will learn about cheesemaking, sampling various samples and taking some time to check out their Vermont-made crafts. Dinner is again included in Rutland where we will be staying for the second night; roast loin of pork with apple demi glaze and Jack Daniel’s chicken will be offered this evening. **(B, D)**

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All tour details are anticipated at the time that the Scheduled Tour Brochure was prepared and specific stops and/or other inclusions are subject to change or elimination without notice. Tours typically depart between 6 AM and 8 AM with the exact time shown on the itinerary you will receive approximately one to two weeks prior to the tour departure. Most tours return about 8 PM to 10 PM, although this may vary.

WEDNESDAY – New Hampshire’s foliage – Following breakfast we will say “goodbye” to Vermont and begin our journey to coastal Maine. We will travel through the Lakes Region of New Hampshire, stopping in Wolfeboro on Lake Winnepesaukee for lunch and shopping. This afternoon we will be visiting Stonewall Kitchens in York and then continuing on to the Nubble Lighthouse in Ogunquit for a “picture-taking stop”.

We will be overnighing for the next two evenings on oceanfront property, the Anchorage Inn, in York, Maine. We will be enjoying dinner at the Sun & Surf Restaurant overlooking the ocean, offering dinners with baked stuffed trout, barbecue chicken and vegetable stirfry. Bon Appetit! **(B, D)**

THURSDAY – Maine in all its beauty – Following breakfast we will be traveling along coastal Maine to Portland where we will enjoy a guided tour of the Queen City. There will be a visit to the Portland Headlight, commissioned by George Washington, which has long protected Portland and the adjacent area. We will then continue on to the wonderful town of Freeport, the home of L.L. Bean. You can enjoy lunch and shopping on your own. Along our journey we will be visiting Kennebunkport, the home of former President Bush, as well as other scenic parts of the Maine coast. A traditional lobster dinner with mussels and all the fixings, or, as an alternate, a New York sirloin, is included. **(B, D)**



FRIDAY – Historic Boston – This morning we’ve included breakfast at the hotel while our luggage is being brought to the coach. At the time announced we will depart for Boston where we will be having a guided tour of this historic city.



You will be seeing many famous sites including the Old North Church, Boston Common, the Public Garden, “Cheers Pub” and the USS Constitution, better known as “Old Ironsides”. There will be free time at Quincy Market and the Faneuil Hall area. Upon the conclusion of the tour we will be traveling to the New York State Capital, Albany. **(B)**

SATURDAY – Great dining continues today – Breakfast is served before we depart on the first “leg” of our trip homeward. We will be traveling through the Finger Lakes Region and, mid-afternoon, we will be enjoying a delicious meal where you can share memories of this fall tour with your new friends that have been traveling with us. **(B, D)**
