


Great Day! Scheduled Tour Summary

SAINTS & SINNERS TOUR

THUR SEPT 10, 2020

Departures, as applicable, from Willoughby, Beachwood, Independence, Middleburg Heights, North Olmsted, Elyria, Sandusky.



We will be arriving in what was originally an 1750's French trading post, Wyandot Village. By 1803, it was part of the Northwest Territory that was admitted to the Union as part of the new state of Ohio. In 1873, future President Rutherford B. Hayes moved his family into this area, naming his estate "Spiegel Grove" in what is now known as "Fremont". Due to the popularity over the years, we have kept the same inclusions in this tour.

A proud local historian, "Mr. Fremont", will be showing, with pride, the colorful history of his hometown. We will be visiting Grace Lutheran Church, home to Fremont's most beautiful examples of stained glass and learning the history of these windows. Like so much of the area, the history of the church dates back to 1892 when it was founded as an English-speaking congregation. Work continued over the years with the stained-glass windows and the chapel mosaics being installed in the Sanctuary in later years. Lunch should also be a new experience at a Retreat Center, considered "Fremont's most beautiful jewel". It is a peaceful place, nestled in nature on the scenic grounds of Evergreen Hill.

Enough of the morning "Saints", we will now be taking a *break* and travel to the County Historical Jail. Located in a historic Victorian home, and made necessary for those "Sinners" in the territory's past. Ever wonder what early jail life might be like? This guided tour includes the 1840's dungeon and the exhibits including the gallows used for the last hanging in Sandusky County.



We do need to get back to the "Saints" as we visit St. Joseph Catholic Church and see their stained-glass windows, influenced by the German Catholic Church. Here, a sealed copper box was deposited into a cavity in the stone by President Rutherford B. Hayes. Just to make sure that you do not get hungry on the way home the coach will be stopping so the Tour Director can purchase each passenger an ice cream treat
