CLEVELAND'S GOODTIME III RIVER AND LAKE CRUISE

TUESDAY, JUNE 15, 2021

Departures, as applicable, from Willoughby, North Olmsted, Middleburg Heights, Independence.

Enjoy today's early-afternoon cruise aboard the beautiful Goodtime III, one of the largest ships on the Great Lakes. Our annual cruise from the Port of Cleveland is a great way to welcome the warm rays of the summer sun as the Captain narrates the sights and tells the history of both waterways that you will be seeing. We will be enjoying the breezes on Lake Erie which, incidentally, is the fourth largest of the Great Lakes, yet the shallowest. While its water is the warmest of all the Great Lakes, it also freezes over more quickly since it is not as deep as the other lakes. Interestingly, at its narrowest point, Canada is approximately 24 miles across from the U.S. at North East, Pennsylvania. It's about 30 miles from Cleveland.

Lake Erie stretches from Toledo to the west of Cleveland to Buffalo on the east, with Cleveland and Erie on the southern shore and Ontario, on the northern shore. It is surrounded by Canada and four states (Ohio, New York, Pennsylvania and Michigan). The majority of the lake water is released all the way across at Niagara Falls.



We will also be cruising up the Cuyahoga River that eventually drains most of its water into Lake Erie. Years ago, as the city emerged as a major manufacturing area, the river became heavily affected by industrial pollution. After the work and planning of the area governments and the Country's Environmental Agency, you will be especially proud to see the success of those efforts, leading to water that is so much cleaner.

Created during the advance and retreat of ice sheets that covered this region during the last Ice Age, the name “*Cuyahoga*” is derived from the Indian word for "crooked river" and is almost 100 miles in length, through six counties, and flows through the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, although we will not be viewing any near close to the entire river. Interestingly, most of the river has a depth that ranges from just three to six feet. We will be passing by the location where Moses Cleaveland first landed to survey what is now the City of Cleveland.

But the cruise on Lake Erie and up the Cuyahoga River are just the “start” of this trip. Since our tours are known for the great meals that we’ve included in our packages over the past 57 years, you know that our staff will arrange for a tasty meal following the cruise. We’ve left the specific location of the restaurant a bit of a mystery . . . but you know that we’ve planned something unique . . . so come hungry.
