

# Great Day! Scheduled Tour Summary

**DAY OF STEAM TRAINS, ROUNDHOUSES, DEPOTS SAT JULY 17, 2021**

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Departures, as applicable, from North Olmsted, Middleburg Heights, Independence, Beachwood, Boston Heights.

We've brought back this tour for both railroad fans, especially those affectionately remembering those powerful steam locomotives, and History Buffs. During this one-day tour we will be starting out at the Age of Steam Roundhouse & Train Museum located in the Sugarcreek countryside. With almost two dozen steam locomotives, restoration work continues, on a daily basis, to preserve these locomotives, railroad cars and other artifacts of the early days of the railroads. We will be guided through the 18-stall roundhouse, surrounding a 115-foot turntable. It's the first full-sized, working roundhouse built in the country since 1951.



After a hearty lunch, we will be traveling southeastward to the Village of Dennison, Ohio, in Tuscarawas County. Recognized as a National Historic Landmark, the Dennison Railroad

Depot has been acclaimed “the most significant remaining example in the nation of a railroad canteen, still reflecting its World War II heritage”.

“During that war, 1.3 million service members were served free food by 4,000 working volunteers at the Dennison Depot Salvation Army Servicemen’s Canteen. These service



men and women traveled by troop train along the National Defense Strategic Railway and stopped at the Depot as they were going off to fight in the war.”

The “homefront hospitality” became so well known, that the nickname “Dreamsville, USA” was used to describe this canteen by the soldiers themselves. The beautifully restored 1873 Pennsylvania

Railroad Depot, with its railroad cars, houses a museum and a theater featuring a film on its history.
