The tour hub-and-spokes from the third largest city in Kentucky after Louisville and Lexington; there is just one hotel check-in. Founded in 1798, Bowling Green was the capital of Kentucky during the American Civil War and was even the subject of the 1967 Everly Brothers song of the same name. We will be seeing highlights of the 21st century with sites that take us back to the years that this area was developing . . . and even earlier, in one case.

Step back in time as we take you to the Historic Railpark & Train Museum. Located in the former L & N Depot, built in 1925, the original rail line was positioned on a major north-south corridor between two major cities, Louisville and Nashville. At one time, over 20 trains per day departed this station and, during our visit, we will be seeing some of the many artifacts of that period and its operations. Then it's off to a former general store, built back in 1869 . . . and is now operated by the "Pie Queen", which has become a regional favorite, with the RC Cola sign still proudly hanging outside the restaurant and antique mason jars and vintage white bowls decorating the interior. It has been featured in various magazines and on television, even boasting quotes from the founder of Williams-Sonoma on its chalkboard. After some "good eats", we'll be sitting back for a little down-home entertainment.

At the Aviation Heritage Park, we'll be seeing restored military aircraft, World War I Flying Aces and a mission commander of the space shuttle Atlantis. Then, get ready to "rev up your engines" since we will be touring, and dining at, the National Corvette Museum, learning why this car has been "America's Sports Car" since its introduction in 1953. We will also be seeing the sinkhole that "swallowed" eight rare Corvettes several years ago. With Corvettes being built in Bowling Green, many people who purchase one of these beauties oftentimes elect to pick up their new vehicle right at the Museum in a small ceremony commemorating the event

Our third meal today will be at Mariah's. For over thirty years, it's been a staple in historical downtown Bowling Green, known for its "food prepared with love", plus we've added a "private musical performance with a local flavor of singing and fiddling. Later we'll be learning of the Lost River Cave, as our guide shares the tale of the blue hole and Civil War soldiers, before boarding Kentucky's only underground boat tour, gliding by the famous wishing rock and viewing the majestic cathedral-like cavern.

Oh, we can't be leaving this area without the third of our entertainment venues, this one at the Bluegrass Restaurant, just outside the elegant Kentucky Grand. Here we will be enjoying a delightful experience, as we dine while a pianist entertains our group, making for a fitting "closing luncheon".
