NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND FALL FOLIAGE

SUNDAY – Cruising the Erie Canal, dining on the waterfront – We will travel eastward to the small village of Herkimer in New York State, named after the German immigrants who settled




in this area in 1722. Arriving at Gems Along The Mohawk, we board the Lil' Diamond Canal Boat for a 1-1/2 hour historic cruise back to a time when the Erie Canal was just a vision and when the barges were pulled by mules. We will be going through one of the 100-year-old locks before returning to the dock where a chef-prepared dinner at a dockside restaurant awaits us before we check into the Burrstone Inn, one of the newest hotel properties in the Ascend Collection. **(D)**

MONDAY – Cavendish, Vermont – After breakfast we'll travel to Yankee Candle in South Deerfield, Massachusetts, touted as "America's Most Loved Candle", tracing its roots back to 1969 . . . and is just five years younger than Great Day! Tours. The shop offers 250,000 candles in more than 150 scents. We will be able to have lunch in their café or other dining spots.



Our rooms for the next two nights will be in Cavendish, Vermont, at The Pointe Hotel at Castle Hill Resort & Spa. Dinner awaits us at the hotel this evening. Here, we will be joining up with our New England Guide. Please advise of your entrée choice of: grilled sirloin with red wine mushroom sauce or grilled Atlantic salmon with dill cream. (B, D)

TUESDAY – Vermont at its best – After a breakfast buffet we will first be seeing Quechee Gorge, "Vermont's Little Grand Canyon" and then making a stop at the Cabot Cheese Annex



After a leisurely lunch and shopping stop we will be visiting the birthplace of Calvin Coolidge, our 30th President, and the Coolidge

family homestead, enroute to the charming village of Woodstock with its pretty green town with the red-painted covered bridge. Enjoy a traditional roast turkey dinner with apple/walnut stuffing and all the fixings that awaits us at the hotel. (B, D)

WEDNESDAY – New Hampshire's foliage – Following breakfast we will say "goodbye" to Vermont and begin our journey to Coastal Maine. We will travel through the Lakes Region of New Hampshire, stopping in Wolfeboro on Lake Winnipesaukee for lunch and shopping.

THURSDAY – *Maine in all its Foliage Beauty* – Following breakfast, we will be traveling along coastal Maine to Portland where we will enjoy a guided tour of the "Queen City". There will be a visit to the Portland Headlight, commissioned by George Washington; it has long protected Portland and the adjacent area. We will then continue on to the wonderful town of Freeport, the home of L.L. Bean, founded in 1912. You can enjoy lunch and shopping on your own. Along our journey we will be visiting Kennebunkport, the home of former President Bush, as well as other scenic



parts of the Maine Coast. Advise us of your choice of a traditional lobster dinner with mussels and all the fixings, or, as an alternate, a New York sirloin. (B, D)

FRIDAY – Historic Boston – This morning, we've included breakfast at the hotel while our luggage is being brought to the coach. At the time announced we will depart for Boston where we will be having a guided tour of this historic city, founded during September 1630.



You will be seeing many famous sites such as the Old North Church, Boston Common, the Public Garden, "Cheers Pub" and the USS Constitution, better known as "Old Ironsides". There will be free time at Quincy Market and the Faneuil Hall area. Upon the conclusion of the tour we will be traveling to the Town of East Greenbush, bounded on the

east by the town of Sand Lake and on the west by the Hudson River, first incorporated in 1855. The area has much history in that that it has been home to a fort and gradually began to attract residents in the 1628-1629 period, many of which arrived from Holland aboard the ship "Rensselaerwyck". Dinner is included this evening. **(B, D)**

SATURDAY – Great dining continues today – Breakfast is served before we depart on the first "leg" of our trip homeward. We will be traveling through the Finger Lakes Region and, mid-afternoon, we will be enjoying a delicious meal where you can share memories of this Fall Tour with your new friends that have been traveling with us. **(B, L)**
