**DINING AT THE HISTORIC FORD HOUSE**

**WED JUNE 21, 2023**

Grosse Pointe, on the shore of Lake St. Clair, is known for its stately tree-lined streets and lakeside lifestyle. Its name comes from the original township and its projection into Lake St. Clair. This affluent area had a number of impressive homes, including that of Edsel and Eleanor Ford, a mansion located along Lake Shore Drive, that was constructed in 1928.



Edsel, the son of Henry Ford, had the home designed by noted architects and its beautiful gardens by a renowned landscape designer. Even now, it has been maintained so beautifully that it has been listed on the National Registry of Historic Places.

Many of the concepts incorporated into this beautiful home were the result of the tours that Edsel and Eleanor Ford had taken to England, and included sandstone exterior walls and a traditional slate roof with stone shingles. The initial construction took only one year but two additional years had craftsmen filling it with antique wood paneling and fireplaces brought from English manor houses.

As with our other tours of Automobile Magnates, we will be dining on a specially-selected luncheon and, after our house tour, we will have some time in the afternoon to stroll through the gardens.
