NIAGARA FALLS USA, MAID OF THE MIST

This tour travels to Niagara Falls, New York . . . better known as “*Niagara USA*”. Did you know that Niagara Falls State Park is America’s oldest state park, established in 1885? Best of all, no passport is required since we will not be crossing over the U.S.–Canadian border, staying within New York State the entire time.

We will be dining at a popular restaurant, visiting the New York Power Authority’s Power Vista and enjoying a trip on the Maid of the Mist as we “*Explore the Roar*” of Niagara Falls, formed in 11,000 B.C. when the last glaciers receded.

Ranked as the # 1 thing to do in Niagara Falls, since the main reason to visit the area is to see the Falls, the scenic Maid of the Mist boat trip is the way to do it. This service has been shuttling passengers to and from the base of the Falls since the 1840s, offering a memory of a lifetime.

Each second of the day, 100,000 cubic feet of water flows over the Falls with the rest of the water being diverted to generators to make Niagara Falls the largest producer of electric power in the world, which you will be discovering at the Power Vista.

You'll be learning more about the ancient site, known as the Niagara Escarpment, as we "Explore the Roar!" What makes this site so fascinating is that you will have a chance to better understand electricity through the eyes of pioneers like Nikola Tesla and Thomas Edison as well as modern-day scientists. You can experience what it was like to build one of the largest hydro plants and then see how it provides power to the U.S. electrical grid. There are even 3D animations and high definition video of the plant's generating equipment.
