NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND FALL FOLIAGE

SUNDAY – Cruising the Erie Canal, Dining on the Waterfront – We travel eastward to the Village of Herkimer, New York, named after the German immigrants who settled here in

1722. Arriving at Gems Along The Mohawk, we board the Lil' Diamond for a historic canal boat cruise back to a time when the Erie Canal was just a vision and barges were pulled by mules. We'll go through one of the 100-year-old locks. A chef-prepared dinner awaits us at the dockside restaurant. We will then check into the Burrstone Inn. **(D)**

MONDAY – Cavendish, Vermont – After breakfast we'll travel to Yankee Candle in South Deerfield, Massachusetts; touted as "America's Most Loved Candle", the company traces its roots back to 1969, just five years younger than Great Day! Tours. The shop offers 250,000 candles in more than 150 scents. Enjoy lunch in their café or other dining spots.

Our rooms for the next two nights will be in Cavendish, Vermont, at The Pointe Hotel at Castle Hill Resort & Spa, where we will be meeting our New England Guide. Dinner awaits us upon our arrival. Please advise of your entrée choice of: grilled sirloin with red wine mushroom sauce or grilled Atlantic salmon with dill cream.

TUESDAY – Vermont at its Best – After breakfast we will first visit the Green Mountain Sugarhouse learning the secrets of making Vermont's "Liquid Gold". We will be seeing

Quechee Gorge, "Vermont's Little Grand Canyon" and then making a stop at the Cabot Cheese Annex of Cabot Creamery. We will learn about cheesemaking, tasting samples and browsing Vermont crafts.

We will continue towards Woodstock with time for lunch on your own and some shopping. Next, we will travel to Plymouth to visit the birthplace of Calvin Coolidge, our 30th President, and the Coolidge Family Homestead, enroute to the charming Village of Woodstock with its pretty green town with the red-painted covered bridge. Enjoy a traditional roast turkey dinner with apple/walnut stuffing & the fixings at the hotel.

WEDNESDAY – New Hampshire's Foliage – We will say "goodbye" to Vermont and begin our journey to Coastal Maine, traveling through the Lakes Region of New Hampshire. We

THURSDAY – *Maine in all its Foliage Beauty* – Our travels take us to Kennebunkport, Maine, the home of former President Bush, with a driving tour around Kennebunkport, Walker Point, and other scenic parts of the Maine Coast. We will then continue to the wonderful town of Freeport, the home of L.L. Bean, founded in 1912. You can enjoy lunch and shopping on your own. Then it's off to Portland for a tour including the Bug Light. **Tonight, we will be served a choice of a traditional lobster dinner or a New York Sirloin Steak.**



FRIDAY – Historic Boston – This morning, we've included breakfast at the hotel while our luggage is being brought to the coach. We will travel to Boston, Massachusetts, for a guided tour of this historic city, founded during September 1630.



Boston has many famous sites such as the Old North Church, Boston Common, the Public Garden, and the USS Constitution, known as "Old Ironsides". There will be time at Quincy Market and the Faneuil Hall area before

we travel to the Town of East Greenbush, New York. Bounded on the east by the Town of Sand Lake and on the west by the Hudson River, it was incorporated in 1855. The area has much history in that that it has been home to a fort and grew during the late 1620s as many new residents arrived from Holland aboard the ship "Rensselaerwyck".

SATURDAY – Great dining continues today – Breakfast is served before we depart on the first "leg" of our trip homeward. We will be traveling through the Finger Lakes Region and, mid-afternoon, we will be enjoying a delicious meal where you can share memories of this Fall Tour with your new friends that have been traveling with us.
