DINING ON A STEAMBOAT, LUCY'S HOMETOWN THUR, AUG 7, 2025

Departures, as applic: Cleveland West/Parma, Middleburg Hts., Independence, Beachwood, Mayfield, Ashtabula.



In the 1800s, steamboats were a most-popular form of transportation on Lake Chautauqua and many people chose to enjoy a leisurely cruise on a warm, sunny day. Those original ships saw service for many years with the last of those vessels, the “*City of Jamestown*” finally being retired in 1963. But, less than 25 years later, some enterprising people had a paddle-wheeler constructed to bring back that period in the lake’s history. We will be welcomed aboard a midday cruise and then dine as we play in the water, listening to the splash of the paddlewheel in the water, on Lake Chautauqua.

Jamestown was the hometown of Lucille Ball and, like passengers on our tours, she would enjoy cruising the lake on a warm summer day. With that in mind, we have included a visit to the place that Honors “*The First Couple of Comedy*” the Lucille Ball Desi Arnaz Museum. The museum attraction features replica sets, Lucille Ball’s Emmy awards, costumes, rare memorabilia from *I Love Lucy* and other shows and, again, the Candy Factory episode has come up.
