AMERICA'S "250TH" TOUR SERIES: BOSTON TALL SHIPS SUN-THURS JULY 12-16, 2026

Departures, as applic: Elyria, No. Olmsted, Middleburg Hts, Independence, Beachwood/Orange, Mayfield, Ashtabula.

SUNDAY – Welcome to another brand-new tour in our America's 250th Series! After a stop along the way, the group will arrive in East Aurora, the town that our thirteenth U.S. President, Millard Fillmore, lived; he served from 1850 to 1853. This area was also the home of Elbert Hubbard who founded the village in 1895 and introduced much of the country to the Roycroft Arts and Crafts Movement. Later we depart the town and continue on to the Inn where we will be spending the night; dinner awaits us on arrival as luggage is being taken to the rooms.

MONDAY – Following breakfast we depart for Woburn, Massachusetts, first settled in 1640. Located in Middlesex County, it got its name from the Village of Woburn, England. It was initially settled in 1640 and incorporated in 1642. It has been recognized for its historic architecture and former thriving leather industry. It was also known for its religious ties during that period. This evening, we will be enjoying dinner and checking into our hotel for the night.



TUESDAY – Breakfast is included this morning before we embark on our Tall Ships Cruise in the famed Boston Harbor. Enjoy commentary about the ships, the harbor and Boston's part in the history of our country over the past 250 years! We have included time for you to browse the Tall Ships on your own following our cruise!

At the time announced, we will be escorted the short distance to the Charlestown Navy Yard where the USS Constitution, lovingly nicknamed "Old Ironsides" is docked. Launched in Boston on October 21st, 1797, the USS Constitution is the oldest commissioned warship still afloat in the world that is still manned by an active-duty U.S. Navy Crew... feel free to ask them your questions! Also included with our visit here is admission to the Museum, with over 3,000 historical artifacts, as well as a self-guided tour of World War II Navy destroyer the USS Cassin.

Dinner this evening is at your leisure at the over 250-year-old Quincy Market. This market has long played an integral role in the life of Boston's residents. Enjoy the roaming

WEDNESDAY – Following breakfast this morning, we will meet a Local Guide for a Historic Boston Tour featuring parts of the Freedom Trail! One of the oldest and largest cities in the United States, Boston is known for its economic and cultural impact on the entire New England Region. Our guide will point out sights along the way such as the Boston common and Public Gardens, the Back

Bay, Beacon Hill, and the gold-domed State House. Lunch will be on your own this afternoon to give you more time to enjoy the Cobblestone streets of the city!

After lunch, we have included the Boston Tea Party Ships and Museum, where we will be led through by a “colonial character” guide and meet “Sam Adams”. Participate in this interactive re-enactment of the Boston Tea Party and see one of only two known surviving tea crates.

Our next stop today takes us to the Sam Adams Brewery, named for Samuel Adams who inherited his father’s brewery and worked as a maltster. The brewery itself was established in 1984, by Jim Koch, who comes from a long line of brewers from Cincinnati!

Dinner is included this evening at a local restaurant, and we will return to our hotel afterwards.

THURSDAY – At the time announced, following breakfast, we will load the motorcoach to begin our journey home. There will, of course, be stops along the way, including an early dinner stop at an incredibly popular restaurant in DePew.
