There are a number of cities, historic attributes and memorials dedicated to events and people that have contributed to the American Success over the past 250 years. Many believe that America's history began along the Eastern part of the Commonwealth of Virginia,



where some of the earliest settlements began in what is now Jamestown and Williamsburg. Those early towns Have expanded over the years to become an important part of the cities that we know today, 250 years later. We will be visiting both Yorktown and Jamestown, seeing two sides of the "historic Triangle" and learning of the part that this region played in the development of our country so many years ago.

But, as you know, every triangle has a "third side", so we will be spending a day at Colonial Williamsburg. This restored area attracts folks from across the country for over ninety years. This year we have added a Dinner Show, "Mean Girls, the Musical", a popular production that first appeared on Broadway in 2020.

As our past guests can tell you, meals are a specialty with us, and this tour includes a total of eleven meals and, just possibly, a cocktail reception, or two, at the hotel. Speaking of hotels, our "home in Williamsburg will be the beautiful, full-service Embassy Suites by Hilton!!! This "All-Suite" hotel features an impressive atrium that greets you upon your arrival, knowing that you are "traveling first class".

Since we will be traveling through an area that was formerly the plantation owned by George Washington Parke Custis, who dedicated his mansion on the plantation, called Arlington House, as a memorial to his step-grandfather, George Washington. Completed in 1818, the estate eventually passed to Custis's daughter, Mary Anna Randolph Custis Lee, the wife of U.S. Army officer Robert E. Lee. After the Civil War began in 1861 and Lee resigned his commission in the U.S. Army to fight with the Confederacy, he and his family fled south. The U.S. Army then seized the estate because its high ground offered protection for Washington, D.C. It is now Arlington National Cemetery where so many Service Men and Women are laid to rest. We will also be visiting the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Kennedy Gravesite and the Eternal Flame, rounding out our recognition of America's 250th.
