

TOUR DEPARTURE POINTS ... as indicated in specific tour write-ups







The canal was built in the early 1830's, connecting Lake Erie with the Ohio River. Eventually to take on the name "Roscoe", this town became a major port for wheat. Much of it has been restored with shops of the time; even the restaurant, a blacksmith shop and "Lock 27" greet you, just as during the period of the American Civil War. Even when the railroads came into this area, the canal continued to supply water for many years.

We will be dining at the Warehouse Steak n' Stein restaurant in historic Roscoe Village and touring the restored shops and buildings. After-

wards, we will board a horse-drawn canal boat that still plies the water as a pair of horses pull the boat along the smooth water, as they did years ago and all at the same price as last year.





This region has so much to offer visitors, being set on 300 miles of Lake Michigan shoreline with 11 lighthouses. It is also one of the top 5 cherry-producing locations in the country and has no national chains. Door County is most inviting with its picturesque coastal towns & shops, fish boils, cherry and apple orchards . . . leading to many referring to it as the "Cape Cod of the Midwest."

Our tour will be arriving at a resort on Geneva Lake and, the next day, we will be cruising on a Mailboat. This area is one of only a handful of places left in the country where mail is still delivered by boat. This is most historic since, with over 100 years of mail service, mail is still delivered to about 75 homes around the lake daily. We will be touring Black Point Estate & Gardens, a Victorian estate built on Lake Geneva for a beer baron from Chicago back during the late 1800s.

Our Blue Heron Boat Tour will be taking us through Horicon Marsh, the largest freshwater cattail marsh in the northern hemisphere. Afterwards, we have set up a lunch and tour at La Clare Farms, well known for its various cheeses. We will also be visiting Door Peninsula Winery & Distillery to enjoy a tasting. We've included a visit to one of the many lighthouses in Door County, specifically one built in 1868; it still guides vessels through the narrow Strawberry Channel.

Our next stop will be at Peninsula State Park for a Door County Boat Tour, followed by time on your own in Sister Bay. An especially memorable evening is planned for you at the Old Post Office Restaurant, a tradition of this region . . . a Fish Boil. Afterwards we will be entertained by the Peninsula Players.

But, even with all of these inclusions, our planners also have us visiting the Door County Maritime Museum in Sturgeon Bay, Milwaukee touring, visiting the Wade House, lunch stop at the 3rd Street Market Hall, a visit to Domes Botanical Gardens and both a tour and dinner at the Harley Davidson Museum. Twelve meals are included.

Jamestown was the hometown of Lucille Ball and, like passengers on our tours, she

This is not the only mound in this area as two others were created by the Adena culture.



Serpent Mound has been listed on the prestigious World Heritage List, joining other sites around the world including the Pyramids of Egypt, the Great Wall of China, Pompeii,

Stonehenge and the Taj Mahal. On this tour, as with other Express Tours we have offered over the years, we have stops along the way for you to purchase lunch or snacks at a fast-food restaurant, keeping the initial cost of this tour low.

HENRY FORD, HIS MUSEUM & VILLAGE



The Henry Ford, in the Detroit suburb of Dearborn, is also home to Greenfield Village as well as the Museum bearing his name. Named after industrialist Henry Ford, it has become a "National Treasure", and we are offering this opportunity for you to visit the complex.

The Henry Ford Museum preserves the history of the country including the Industrial Revolution with its cars, trucks, and locomotives. Exhibits include President Kennedy's Inaugural limousine, and the chair Abraham Lincoln was sitting in at Ford's Theatre when he was shot.

Greenfield Village is the largest indoor-outdoor museum complex in the country. Over a hundred historic buildings were moved here and arranged in a village

Enjoy French Canada as we visit Montréal for three nights, getting a feel for the region's rich history and its "joie de vivre" (a French phrase used to express "joy of life"). We will be visiting Quebec City for two nights, rounding out our time in this French-speaking Province before traveling along the banks of the St. Lawrence River and, one afternoon, taking a cruise followed by dinner.

Making this tour a "bit more special", our host hotel in Montréal is the centrally-located Le Nouvel. In Quebec City, that property, Chateau Laurier Hotel located close-by the historic Walled City. Many of the fortified walls and ramparts were constructed as far back as the early 1600s.

Montréal is set on an island in the Saint Lawrence River and named after Mount Royal, the large triple-peaked hill which is just west of the downtown city. We will tour Montréal with our Guide showing off a number of distinctive neighborhoods (specific routing may vary) with cobblestoned streets and the Gothic Revival Notre-Dame Basilica.



The history of Tiffin, Ohio goes back to 1835 when it was incorporated by an Act of the Ohio Legislature and, fifteen years later, it merged with Fort Ball (originally a military depot during the War of 1812) and became the expanded city that it is now. Industry flourished for many years due to the discovery, in 1888, of its vast amounts of natural gas. The city was also the location of the first church in the world to be lit by Thomas Edison's light bulbs and the first public building in the United States to be wired for electricity as it was being constructed. Tiffin has been known for being home to both Heidelberg University and Tiffin University, as well as the town where Ballreich Potato Chips are manufactured.

For many years, the city was an important glass and porcelain manufacturing center. While many of these companies are no longer around, there are several shops that still carry on this tradition. One of the first businesses in this region was a flour mill along the river so we will be dining at Pioneer Mill, enjoying some long-time favorites in a building constructed in 1822. After dining, we will be visiting the Tiffin Glass Museum & Shoppes before enjoying some free time to visit a couple of the local merchants of the town at the same price as three years ago.

The Hocking Valley Railroad dates back many years, operating as the Mineral Railroad which began service in 1864; it operated to Toledo and Columbus, with much of its services being utilized by the coal mines in the Athens-Nelsonville region. In 1910, this rail line became part of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad (now the Chessie System).

We will be taking a rail excursion through the countryside of Southeastern Ohio this afternoon following the Sunday Breakfast Buffet in a rivertown Inn as we travel to Nelsonville. 




